

GPA Rating Scale

Applicants are evaluated using a 100 point system: 30 points maximum for GPA (cumulative GPA of 2.75 or 3.0 GPA or above for the last 30 semester hours taken, whichever is highest -- see scale below); 30 points maximum for the Collegiate Assessment of Academic Proficiency (CAAP); 40 points maximum for interview/biographical statement.
