BASIC INFORMATION

Bachelor's Degree (BS or BA)

–Program Prerequisite: Must satisfy Teacher Education admission and licensure requirements, and complete Praxis examination (see Teacher Education Department, 626-6309 or WWW.programs.weber.edu/tedadvise and WWW.ets.org/praxis)

–Minor: Not required.

–Grade Requirements: A grade of “**C**” or better in courses applied toward this major (a grade of “C-“ is not acceptable). Also refer to the requirements of the Teacher Education Program.
