Acceptance to the nursing program does not assure eligibility to write the RN/PN graduation licensing examination. The Utah Board of Nursing makes final decisions on issue of license.

WSU's Practical Nursing Program and Associate Degree Nursing Program are designed to prepare graduates for entry-level clinical practice as licensed practical nurses and registered nurses. Students who have successfully completed the first year of the Associate Degree Nursing Program are eligible to take the National Council of State Boards of Nurses exam (PN-NCLEX). Graduates of the Associate Degree Nursing Program are eligible for practical nurse and/or registered nurse licensure upon successful completion of the NCSBN exam (PN-NCLEX/RN-NCLEX).

Application Requirements

1. Apply to Weber State University online at weber.edu.
2. Apply to the Practical Nursing Program or Associate Degree Nursing Program. Application materials are available Oct. 1 through Feb. 1 at weber.edu/nursing. Applications are also available through the Office of Admissions Advisement, 801-626-6136 or healthprofessions@weber.edu.
3. Pay the nursing application fee.

By the application deadline, you must have:

1. Completed nine (9) or more credit hours from the PREREQUISITES and the Additional Nursing Support/General Education list (excluding the CNA course). Of the nine (9) credit hours at least one (1) of the four (4) science courses listed in the "Science Options" must be completed by the application deadline.

2. Earned a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher from WSU or accredited colleges or universities that transfer to WSU.
Please Note: As an applicant, you must choose between one of the following programs:

1. WSU Ogden/Davis (4 semesters, 2 years)
2. WSU/USU in Logan (4 semesters, 2 years)

Application Review Process

Applications are reviewed by the nursing programs Admissions and Advancement Committee. A point system is used to facilitate candidate selection. Applications received by Jan. 15 will earn extra points. Support courses are evaluated, but points will not be awarded for courses in progress during the semester applications are received.



Admission Requirements

Prior to entering the program, you must:

- Complete the nursing prerequisite courses.
- Complete the certified nursing assistant course and submit a copy of the Certificate of Achievement or CNA Recertification Letter by the first day of fall semester. For questions concerning the CNA Recertification Letter, contact the Utah Registry at 801-547-9947.
- Submit transcripts for all high school(s) and college(s) attended to the nursing admissions department.

Prerequisite Courses

Prerequisite courses must be passed with a "C" grade or higher. All accepted students must complete Option I or II by the end of summer semester prior to starting the nursing program. To receive college science/support course/general education GPA credit and to be considered a college applicant for the application process, 12 credit hours must be completed in the prerequisite/support course area.
