Applicants who have been treated for mental illness or substance abuse should discuss their eligibility status with the Utah State Board of Nursing. Acceptance to the nursing program does not assure eligibility to write the RN graduation licensing examination. The Utah Board of Nursing makes final decisions on issue of license.

WSU's RN Completion program offers working practical nurses, or those eligible to be licensed, an opportunity to advance their skill base while advancing their career and earning potential in the health care system. WSU's Associate of Science degree nursing program is designed to prepare graduates for entry-level clinical practice as registered nurses. The program is structured for graduates to receive either an Associate of Science or an Associate of Applied Science degree. Graduates of the associate degree nursing program are eligible for registered nurse licensure upon successful completion of the National Council of State Boards of Registered Nurses exam (RN-NCLEX).

Application Deadlines

Application deadlines vary depending upon which campus the applicant desires to attend. Applications will be sent out according to the dates listed for each campus.

Weber State University - Ogden

Application Requirements

Application materials are available by contacting the Admissions Advisement office at 801-626-6136 or healthprofessions@weber.edu.

- Apply to Weber State University.
- Send official transcripts to the admissions office and a copy of your transcripts (with the RN Completion application) to the Dumke College of Health Professions admissions office.
- Pay the nursing application fee (\$20).
- Graduates of non-NLNAC accredited programs take the NLN ACE I exam. For more information, contact the RN completion program office at PRice@weber.edu.

· **By application deadline meet the following:**

1. Pass a PN Comprehensive Predictor Examination (a computerized comprehensive nursing exam). Required for all applicants. (One- year time limit as of application deadline.)
2. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above. If you have five or more years work experience as a PN, the cumulative GPA requirement is 2.5, as long as the nursing GPA is still a 3.0 or higher.
3. B- or better grades in all PN Nursing courses or demonstrate 1 year of work experience as a full-time licensed practical nurse.

Review Process

RN Completion applications are reviewed by the nursing program admissions and advancement committee. A point system is used to facilitate candidate selection.



Admission Requirements

Must be completed or enrolled in prior to entering program.

- Complete the prerequisite classes needed for the RN Completion program at the time of application. (See prerequisite list.) All prerequisite courses must be completed prior to beginning the nursing program.
- Complete or be currently enrolled in a PN program.
- Pass NCLEX-PN or be NCLEX eligible as a practical nurse in the state of Utah with an unencumbered license.

Successful completion of course work and challenge examinations does not guarantee admission to nursing programs.

Prerequisite Courses

Prerequisite courses must be passed with a "C" grade or higher. All accepted students must complete Option I or II by the end of summer semester prior to starting the nursing program.

All nursing courses must be passed with a "B-" grade (80 percent) or better to proceed in the program.

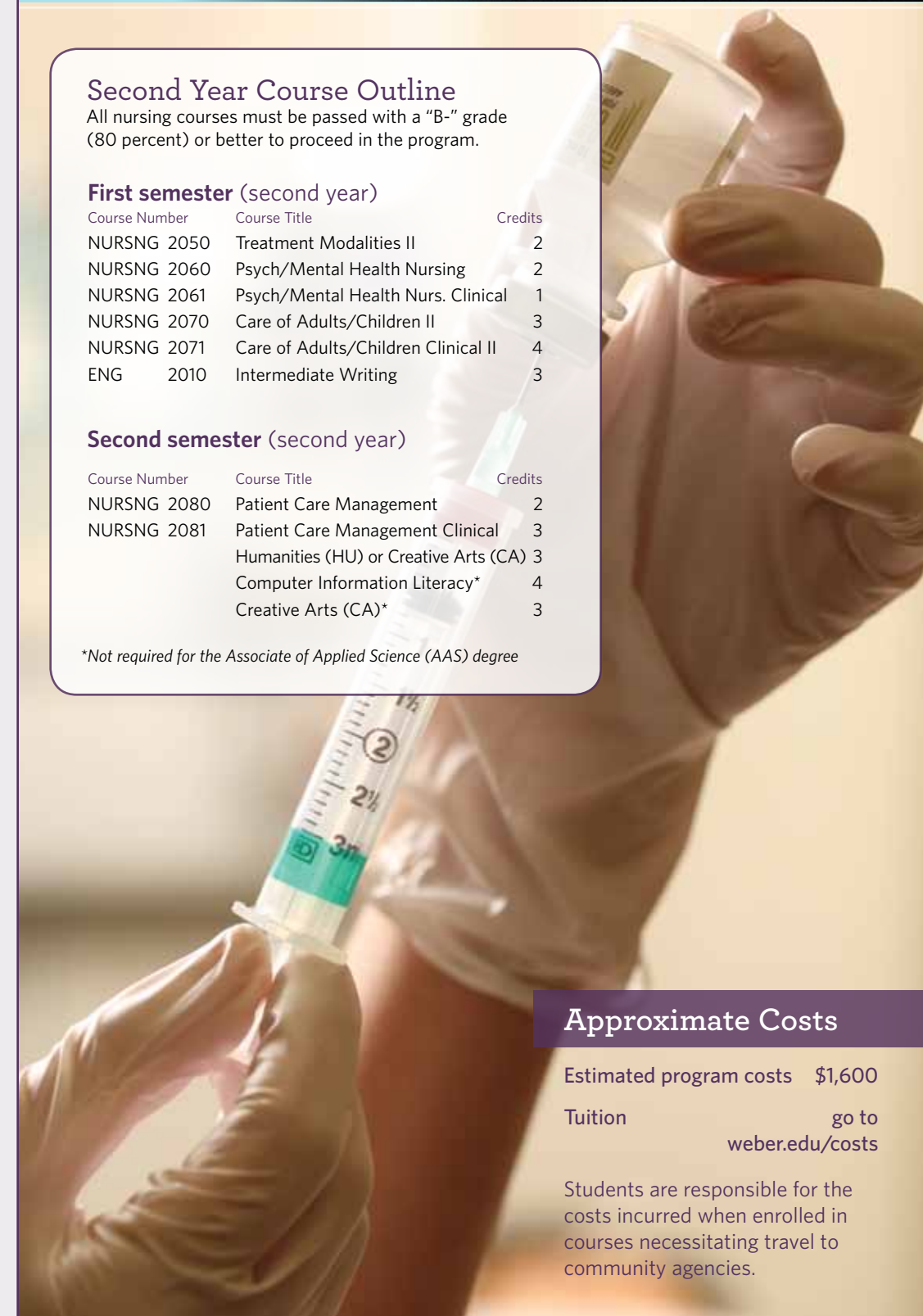
