1. A four year Bachelors degree in Accounting or a four year Bachelors degree in another major as well as completion of Leveling Courses. (see below)
2. A GMAT score. (Average applicant score: 559)
3. A Grade Point Average (on a 4 point scale) in each of the following three areas:
 - a. Overall (Average applicant GPA: 3.38)
 - b. The last 60 credit hours of undergraduate work
 - c. Accounting course work only

 5. Current resume
