

FAQs

1. Do I qualify for Student Support Services?

In order to qualify to receive services from SSS you must fit at least one of these criteria:

- Be from a low-income family
- Neither parent has a bachelor's degree
- Have a disability that is documented with the WSU Services for Students with Disabilities office

Also, you must be attending WSU full-time and be working toward a bachelor's degree. Once we verify these criteria then we will determine if you have a need for academic assistance to complete your bachelor's degree.

2. I qualify for Student Support Services. How do I apply?

You can pick up an application for SSS in the Student Service Center building room 260 or you can print one on-line at our web site www.weber.edu/sss. Click on the "How to apply" link. When you return the application to our office a staff member can answer your questions about what documentation you need to submit to complete your application.

3. What does it cost to participate in SSS?

There is no charge to participate in the program and all of our services are free to our students. This includes the textbook loan program, use of the computer lab, printing in the computer lab, and much, much more.

4. What services does SSS offer besides tutoring?

5. How much does it cost to be in SSS?

Nothing. Our services are free to our participants.

6. How long can I be in SSS?

Our services are available to you as long as you are a student at WSU. We can work with you until you graduate with a bachelor's degree.

7. Can you help me pay for college?

That depends. Have you filled out the FAFSA form on-line? That is your first step in paying for college. If you are a freshman or sophomore (we look at attempted credit hours), are receiving a Pell grant, and have some unmet need, then you will be considered for the Supplemental Grant Aid award. Ask an SSS staff member for more details.

Juniors and Seniors are welcome to apply for the Textbook Scholarship. It is awarded each semester.
