RULE BOOK



1. Who may attend and complete the written exam?

- a. Seniors- their test scores will be counted toward placement
- b. Juniors- their test score will not be counted towards placement

2. Who may attend the hands-on competition?

- a. Seniors only
- b. Two competitors and one alternate from each school

3. How are alternates utilized?

- a. Must be a senior
- b. During the competition the alternate may observe but in no way participate
- c. If a competitor has a medical or family emergency an alternate can compete in their place

4. Written Test Scoring

- a. The highest senior test score from each school will be taken and used for the school's placement

5. Hands-On Test Scoring

- a. The highest team score will be taken and used for the school's placement

6. Who can receive donated vehicles?

- a. NATEF certified automotive programs only
- *b. If a school is not NATEF certified
 - i. The vehicle will be given to next NATEF certified school in placement
 - ii. A prize substitution will be awarded to the non-NATEF school

*Due to the limitations placed on WSU by the automotive manufacturers, vehicles and components will be awarded based upon availability from manufacturers.

7. Who can receive donated engines?

- a. Any high school automotive program that competes

8. Who can receive scholarships?

- a. Seniors only
- b. Must accept their scholarship with WSU Automotive Technology department before given deadline.
 - i. If the deadline is missed, the scholarship is forfeited

- c. The scholarship monies are to be used strictly for full-time (min of 12 credit hrs.) automotive students earning an automotive degree and/or certificate and taking automotive courses
- d. Scholarships will not be held for individuals serving a religious mission

9. Cheating

- a. Any individual caught cheating during the written exam will be disqualified
- b. Any team caught cheating during the hands-on contest will be disqualified
- c. Only seniors are allowed to compete during the hands-on contest, if underclassmen are discovered the school will be disqualified

10. Sportsmanlike Conduct

- a. It is expected that all visiting students, high school instructors, administrators and parents conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner.
- b. Anyone displaying inappropriate behavior will be asked to leave.
