This is the official invitation for your department/organization to participate in the 8th annual Wildcat Block Party on August 31, 2012. Our goal is to continue to grow and fulfill our mission:

To create student awareness of campus programs/departments and to build a greater sense of community within Weber State and surrounding Weber/Davis communities. This is not just an information fair, but a hands-on educational experience for students of Weber State.

Each program/department will be provided with a table (2.5 x 8 ft.) and 2 chairs. The Block Party location will be similar to last year's - Moench statue, east to Bell Tower Plaza, south to Tracy Plaza (may include north of Moench statue toward bus stop). We recommend that individual departments/organizations plan to provide their own small canopies for their booth areas to help defeat the sun and the heat (your booth space will be 5' x 8'; canopies 10' x 10' are the absolute largest that can be accommodated; smaller are preferred). Laptops/computers will need to be self-powered, since Block Party power sources are extremely limited. **We hope you will plan to participate in this annual event for students and the community.**
