Minimum Requirements for an Activity Tuition Waiver:

- Must be a full-time student (12 semester hrs. minimum) throughout the contract period.
- This application must include a copy of your transcript. (An unofficial copy is acceptable.)
- Must be a Botany major at time of application.
- Must have a minimum WSU GPA of 2.5.
- Must have a minimum major GPA of 2.5.
- Must have completed 12 semester hours of Botany courses that count toward the Botany Major. (If you will complete 12 semester hours by the end of the Spring semester in which you apply, you will qualify for the scholarship.)
- Must be an active member of the Botany Club.

Responsibilities for the Botany Club President:

- 1. As president of the Botany Club, you are to direct and organize the activities of the club, including:
 - A. Weekly meeting activities from guest lectures to preparation for annual plant sale.
 - B. College of Science Area Council weekly meetings representative
