Criminal Justice Requirements

All Criminal Justice students are encouraged to meet with a faculty advisor at least annually for course and program advisement. If a student has a concentration in Law & Justice, Corrections, or Law Enforcement, their advisor is based on their last name. A list is posted both inside and outside the Criminal Justice Office (SS218) for reference. For Forensic Science students, your advisor will be Dr. Horn.

Criminal Justice Major Bachelor Degree (B.S. or B.A.)

- Minor: A minor or a double major is required. In lieu of a minor, an 18 hour emphasis may be selected in consultation with the chair and only in those instances where a specific minor is not offered on WSU campus.
- Grade Requirements: A grade of "C" or better in all courses is required for this major in addition to an overall GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Course Requirements for B.S. or B.A. Degree

Students obtaining a major in Criminal Justice are required to complete **45 credit hours** in courses with a <u>CJ prefix</u>. Of these 18 credit hours must be upper division courses numbering 3000 or above.
