Alert! Impact of the New American Institutions Gen Ed Requirement on the Degree Evaluation

Please be aware that any degree evaluation generated for the 2007-08 catalog year will not allow an AI course with a grade below a ‘C’ to slot under the Core AI requirement even though the class was completed prior to Summer 2007.

The important thing to note is *when* the class was completed. If completed prior to Summer 2007, a ‘D-’ or better will satisfy the requirement. If completed Summer 2007 or thereafter, only a grade of ‘C’ or better will satisfy the requirement.

We are looking into adjusting the degree evaluation tool to allow for this policy change. In the meantime, all advisors will need to watch for this contingency.
