To graduate with a BSN, students need:

- BSN program credits- 25 BSN nursing credits and 3 upper division credits from another department.
- 30 WSU residency credits- Students may need to take additional Weber State courses to meet this requirement.
- 40 upper division credits- Students may need to take additional courses to meet this requirement. Returning Weber State AS/AAS graduates and AD graduates from other nursing schools will have up to 12 credits grandfathered to upper-division credits.
- 120 total credits- Students may need to take additional courses to meet this requirement.
