To graduate with a BSN, students need:

- **BSN program credits-** 25 BSN nursing credits and 3 upper division credits from another department.
- **30 WSU residency credits-** Students may need to take additional Weber State courses to meet this requirement.
- **40 upper division credits-** Students may need to take additional courses to meet this requirement. Returning Weber State AS/AAS graduates and AD graduates from other nursing schools will have up to 12 credits grandfathered to upper-division credits.
- **120 total credits-** Students may need to take additional courses to meet this requirement.
