- Hold an Associate of Science or Associate of Applied Science in nursing from a university or college that is regionally accredited and accredited by one of the following agencies:
 - Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)
 - Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN)
 - National League for Nursing Commission for Nursing Education Accreditation (CNEA)
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (required)
Exceptions available to current RNs
- Hold a current Utah RN license, eligibility for a UT license without restrictions, or a compact state license
