- Upon graduation and passing of the national certification exam (The American Academy of Nurse Practitioners Board Certification or The American Nurses Credentialing Center), students are eligible for the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) license.



DNP prepared nurses will have the skills to facilitate any form of nursing intervention that influences healthcare outcomes for individuals and populations at the organization/systems level.

DNP nurses will assume advanced leadership roles, advocating for, developing, and implementing healthcare delivery changes to better patient quality and care.

DNP nurses will learn to implement healthcare policies, promote standards of patient care and safety, and use information technology and critical thinking to affect change.

Applicant Qualifications

- Hold a bachelor's degree in nursing from a program that is regionally accredited and accredited by one of the following agencies:
 - Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)
 - Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN)
 - National League for Nursing Commission for Nursing Education Accreditation (CNEA)
- Hold a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or higher (on a 4.0 scale), includes all college level coursework
- Have an active, unrestricted Utah RN license or a compact state license
- Minimum of 2 years of full-time RN work experience or 3 years of part-time RN work experience
