- Hold a bachelor's degree in nursing from a program that is regionally accredited and accredited by one of the following agencies:
 - Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)
 - Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN)
 - National League for Nursing Commission for Nursing Education Accreditation (CNEA)
- Hold a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (required)
- Knowledge of statistics as utilized in research/administrative functions
- Completion of a statistics course within the past 5 years (highly recommended)
- Have an active, unrestricted Utah RN license or a compact state license
