

ANNIE TAYLOR DEE SCHOOL OF NURSING CLINICAL PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with our clinical partners, all students, in order to start the program, are required to comply with CDC immunization requirements for healthcare personnel. Any allergies or issues with immunizations, require current written notification from your healthcare provider. If you require live vaccines (MMR, Varicella) please obtain the TB series first. TB cannot be administered until 30 days after a live vaccine. Hep B titer requirement is Hep B Surface Antibody. A.	MMR Requirement	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. 2 MMR Vaccines OR</li> <li>b. MMR Positive Titer</li> <li>c. If you have 2 documented doses of MMR and your blood test results are negative or equivocal for measles, mumps, and/or rubella, you should be considered to have presumptive evidence of immunity to measles, mumps, and/or rubella and are not in need of additional MMR doses unless instructed by the healthcare provider.</li> <li>d. If you only received a titer and the blood test results are negative or equivocal for measles, mumps, and/or rubella, then you must obtain 2 MMR vaccines</li> </ol>
B.	TDaP Requirement	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Documented proof of TDaP within the last 10 years</li> <li>b. If over 10 years, obtain a new TDaP. TD Booster is not acceptable</li> </ol>
C.	Varicella Requirement	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. 2 Varicella Vaccines OR</li> <li>b. Varicella Positive Titer</li> <li>c. If you only received a titer and the blood test results are negative or equivocal for varicella, then you must obtain 2 Varicella vaccines</li> <li>d. You cannot self-report or obtain a healthcare provide document stating you had chicken pox.</li> </ol>
D.	TB or Quantiferon Requirement	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. A negative 2-step TB test. You must obtain 1 TB test, have it read and then 1-3 weeks later obtain a 2<sup>nd</sup> TB test and have it read.</li> <li>b. If you have proof of a 2-step TB within the past year, then an annual TB must be done</li> <li>c. Upload all results together to Castlebranch</li> <li>d. Quantiferon or TSpot blood draw             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Must be within the past year</li> <li>b. If over 1 year, repeat the Quantiferon or TSpot blood test or obtain an annual TB skin test</li> <li>c. Upload all results together to Castlebranch</li> </ol> </li> <li>e. If you've had a prior positive TB test, you must provide the laboratory results of your X-ray</li> <li>f. If you've traveled or lived internationally and had to have a BCG (within the past 10 years), you must show proof of BCG and obtain and/or provide the laboratory results of your X-ray.</li> </ol>
E.	Hepatitis B Requirement	<p>You must comply with 1 of the following Hepatitis B requirements.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Documentation of 3 Hep B or 2 Heplisav vaccines AND a positive Surface Antibody Titer.</li> <li>b. If you only have documentation of 3 Hep B or 2 Heplisav vaccines, you must obtain a Hep B Surface Antibody Titer</li> <li>c. If your Hep B titer comes back positive, your Hep B requirement is fulfilled</li> <li>d. If your Hep B titer comes back negative you must take the following steps             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Immediately obtain a Hep B booster</li> <li>• 6 weeks after your booster, you must again obtain a Hep B Surface Antibody titer</li> <li>• If the results are positive, you are now compliant. If the results are again negative you must continue the series. Immediately obtain Hep B #2 vaccine, wait 5 months the obtain Hep B #3 vaccine. 6 weeks after your Hep B #3 vaccine you will again repeat the Surface Antibody titer. If it comes back positive you are compliant. If it comes back negative you will be considered a non-responder and are done with Hep B.</li> </ul> </li> <li>e. If you have never received the Hep B series, you must start.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Obtain Hep B #1</li> <li>• 1 month later obtain Hep B #2</li> <li>• 5 months later obtain Hep B #3</li> <li>• 6 weeks after Hep B #3, obtain the Hep B Surface Antibody Titer.</li> <li>• If the titer comes back positive, you are compliant with Hep B.</li> <li>• If the titer comes back negative, go to step d above and follow the steps</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
F.	Flu Shot Requirement	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. The flu shot is obtained during the current flu season when available (August through October)</li> <li>b. Fall semester admissions do not need to worry about the flu shot until it is available. Students normally do flu shot clinics during fall semester and obtain it then.</li> <li>c. Spring and Summer admissions will need to upload your current flu season shot document</li> </ol>

G.	COVID Requirement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. You must provide documentation of 2 COVID vaccines (Moderna or Pfizer) or 1 COVID vaccine (Johnson and Johnson)</li> <li>b. You must provide proof of exemption if you are not obtaining. DCHP exemption is found on the student bulletin board (<a href="https://weber.edu/Nursing/BulletinBoard.html">https://weber.edu/Nursing/BulletinBoard.html</a>)</li> </ul>
H.	Health Insurance	Individual health insurance is required while in the program. WSU does not provide health insurance so it is your responsibility to obtain it. Students may not start the program without health insurance. It is a requirement with all of our clinical partners.
I.	Physical Exam	<p>It is required for you to obtain a Physical Exam prior to starting the program. You have 2 options:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. You can download a Physical Exam Form from Castlebranch when you purchase the package</li> <li>b. You can use a physical exam document or records of a physical exam from your healthcare provider.</li> <li>c. Physical exams can be no older than 1 year prior to the start of the program.</li> </ul>
J.	CPR Requirement	The only acceptable CPRs are American Heart Association and American Red Cross BLS for Healthcare. No other CPR will be accepted so please ensure you have obtained the appropriate CPR. If you are unsure of where to obtain it, there is information on the student bulletin board.
