- Cohort start is based on administrative approval, funding, and a minimum number of qualified applicants. Planned start date August 25, 2025
- Application fee: \$60 (non-refundable)

Program Details

- Mandatory online orientation prior approximately 4 to 8 weeks prior to program start
- Part-time program over five (5) semesters
- Online model of delivery for theory/didactic courses

Program Cost: Attending graduate school is a significant investment of your time and money. We are committed to keeping costs as affordable as possible while delivering high-value education to advance your nursing career. The **DNP-Executive Leadership program** is part-time, fully online, and completed in 5-semesters, giving you accelerated graduation and value-based return on time and financial investment. Program costs include tuition, graduate student differential, and other course fees. These costs are estimates, which are determined each April for the following academic year. An approximate total for the full-time program is \$17,500-\$20,000 (April 2024 \$). Application Requirements:

- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) for all college-level course work. May be a 2.7 to 3.0 Cumulative GPA if you have 5 or more years of full-time work experience as an RN (or 7 years part-time) as an RN (on application deadline) and your Nursing GPA (Nursing ONLY courses) are at or above a 3.0. (See advisor if you have questions).
- Applicants must have a minimum of 60 graded (3.0 or better) transfer/transferable credit hours from a regionally accredited college or university.
- Earned master's degree from a regionally accredited college or university and a major in nursing from an accredited program (ACEN, CCNE or CNEA) and/or:
 - o Master of Science in Nursing (MSN), RN
 - o Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN), RN, Masters in Business Administration (MBA)
 - Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN), RN, Masters in Health Administration (MHA)
 - o Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN), RN, Masters of Public Health (MPH)
- Active, unrestricted license to practice as a registered nurse or eligible to obtain licensure without restrictions to practice as a registered nurse in your state. Must be an RN in your state of residence prior to the program beginning (August 24, 2026).
- Submission of all documents: 2 letters of recommendation, vitae/resume, essay, and transcripts (online application system).
- The Department of Nursing Graduate Studies requires international applicants to submit one of the following scores with their application (test date within two years of the intended start semester): TOEFL iBT = 83 or higher; IELTS Academic Test = 7 or higher; Duolingo English Test = 120 or higher. International students with a bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally-accredited (or equivalent) university where the language of instruction was English may be exempt from this requirement.
- Please note: This program does not meet the in-person, face-to-face course requirements for international student status since this program involves extensive online learning (no exceptions).





Qualified Applications are reviewed according to a selection point system established by the WSU Nursing Graduate Admissions Committee. Applicant ranking for all applicants includes above requirements and veteran status.
