Application Information for May 6, 2024 Start Date

- Online application available October 2023
- 2. Applications are reviewed throughout the 6 month application window with acceptance decisions made within weeks of finalizing application. There is an established final deadline of March 27, 2024 [12 p.m. noon or earlier] for the program that will begin May 6, 2024 summer start [applicants to be notified within week(s) time of applying]. Program Information

- Two emphases: Nurse Educator (34 credits), Nursing Leadership & Management Program (32 credits)
- Up to 24 positions available for each emphasis
- Cohort start is based on administrative approval, funding, and a minimum number of qualified applicants
- Application fee: \$60
- Out-of-state graduate tuition waivers are available

Program Details

- 3 semesters (12 months) 7-week block program (Summer, Fall & Spring semesters) with the exception of NRSG 6801 Masters Project and the required Residency, which are offered over a full semester
- Mandatory online orientation prior approximately 4 weeks prior to program start
- ONLINE model of delivery
- 90 hour Residency in your local community

Program Cost: Attending graduate school is a significant investment of your time and money. We are committed to keeping MSN costs as affordable as possible while delivering high-value education to advance your nursing career. The **MSN program** is fully online and completed in 3-semesters, giving you accelerated graduation and value-based return on time and financial investment. Program costs include tuition, graduate student differential, and other course fees. These costs are estimates only, as actual costs are determined each April for the following Academic year. An approximate total for the full-time program is \$16,000-17,500.00 (through April 2024 only). New tuition rates will go into effect for Summer 2024. Application Requirements:

- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) for all college level course work
- May be a 2.5 to 3.0 cumulative GPA, if you have 2 or more years of full time work experience as an RN (or 3 years part time) and your NURSING GPA (NURSING ONLY COURSES) are at or above a 3.0 GPA
- Earned bachelor's degree with a major in nursing from an accredited nursing program (ACEN, CCNE, or CNEA) and from a regionally accredited college or university
- Current unencumbered license to practice as a registered nurse or eligible to obtain licensure without restrictions to practice as a registered nurse in your state. Must be an RN in your state of residence prior to the program beginning (May 6, 2024). All admitted applicants to the Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) Program must have an unencumbered Registered Nurse (RN) License in the State the student resides. Applicants who are admitted may begin the MSN program without having passed NCLEX-RN but are required to pass the exam and submit certification documentation to the graduate administrative assistant during the first semester of the program in order to progress to the 2nd semester of the program.
- Submission of all documents: vitae/resume, and goal statement (essay) in the online application system
- Applicants for whom English is not their first language, a minimum English language proficiency score is required. (TOEFL = 75 overall, with a minimum of 17 in each Category: or IELTS 6.5 overall, with a minimum of 6.0 in each category). Students with a bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally-accredited (or equivalent) university in which the language of instruction was English may be exempt from English-language proficiency testing.
- A working knowledge of statistics is encouraged.





Qualified Applications are reviewed according to a selection point system established by the WSU Nursing Graduate Admissions Committee. Applicant ranking for all applicants includes above requirements and veteran status.
