- 90-hour Residency in your local community in the area of focus (Educator or Leadership & Management)
- Cohort start is based on administrative approval, funding, and a minimum number of qualified applicants Application fee: \$60
- Out-of-state graduate tuition waivers are available

Application Requirements:

- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) for all college level course work.
- Earned MS degree (or higher) from a regionally accredited college or university and a major in nursing from an accredited nursing program (ACEN, CCNE, or CNEA).
- Active, unrestricted license to practice as a registered nurse or eligible to obtain licensure without restrictions to practice as a registered nurse in your state of residence. Must be an RN in your state of residence prior to the program beginning.
- Submission of all documents in the online application system: vitae/resume, essay, and transcripts.

Qualified Applications are reviewed according to a selection point system established by the WSU Nursing Graduate Admissions Committee. Applicant ranking for all applicants includes above requirements and veteran status.
