<b>REMEMBER: Students can take NO MORE than 30 Concurrent Enrollment credits per ACADEMIC YEAR, and no more than 20 WSU credits per semester. Grades earned in CE courses will become part of your permanent college record and cannot be repeated through the Concurrent Enrollment Program.</b>		

**NOTE: WSU Residency requires AT LEAST 10 credits be taken through Weber State University (this includes Concurrent Enrollment) for the General Studies Certificate of Completion to be awarded. Student may not earn Certificate of Completion through transfer coursework, Advanced Placement, or International Baccalaureate alone.**

- **What do I need to do to earn a credential?**
  - Certificate of Completion
    - ~34 credits (depending on placement)
    - 10 WSU Residency Hours
    - 2.0 WSU GPA
    - Complete all Core and Breadth Courses
  - Associate of General Studies
    - 60 credits
    - 20 WSU Residency Hours
    - 2.0 WSU GPA
    - Complete all Core and Breadth, & Electives

  - Yes! As soon as you have completed the following steps, we will be happy to meet with you.
  - In order to set up an appointment with a Concurrent Enrollment Advisor, you will need to:
    - Complete the required WSU New Student Orientation for Concurrent Enrollment students (found in eWeber portal, by searching for the "New Student Orientation" app)
    - Meet with your high school counselor, and have your counselor submit a CE Counselor Agreement.
