AVP: Associate Vice President

CCEL: Center for Community Engaged Learning

DPH: Director/Program Heads

EAO: Education Access & Outreach

ETS: Educational Talent Search is a Federal TRIO Program that is designed to identify qualified youths with potential for education at the post-secondary level and to encourage such youths to complete high school and undertake a program of secondary education.

GEAR UP: Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs is designed to help students succeed in high school and prepare for college. Parents and students do not need to pay for eligible students to participate in the program.

ISS: International Student Services
