BEVERLEY TAYLOR SORENSON ARTS LEARNING PROGRAM AT WSU

BTSArts Beginning and End of Year Surveys

In the 2020-2021 school year, beginning and end of the year surveys were administered to art educators, instructional coaches, principals, and district administrators to assess their needs and the needs of their schools. The surveys assisted us with choosing our professional development offerings and allowed us to gain insights on their understanding of the program.

The beginning of year survey was administered between September 17, 2020 - October 2, 2020 and helped determine educators' and instructional coaches' goals, best practices for district administrators and principals, possible challenges with implementing BTSArts, and how the University partner could best serve throughout the 2020-2021 school year. The beginning of the year survey had 14 out of 15 (some educators not hired yet for the school year) BTSArts educators and instructional coaches, 13 of 18 principals, and 3 out of 3 district administrators complete the survey.

The end of year survey was administered between April 12, 2021 - April 26, 2021 and helped educators and instructional coaches report on their goals. The end of the year survey had 14 out of 15 BTSArts educators and instructional coaches, 15 of 18 principals, and 3 out of 3 district administrators complete the survey. *Please view the Survey Results Link for survey data (the Survey Results Link can be found at the end of this report).*

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS/MENTORS

Description: All BTSArts educators and instructional coaches are paired with a professional development partner (PDP or mentor) at the beginning of the school year. PDPs are intended to be a resource to the arts educators, principals, district administrators, and instructional coaches at BTSArts schools. They are familiar with BTSArts and have experience with arts integration. PDPs visit the arts educators during the school year to informally observe, help address challenges, and support goals and growth.

PDPs may also lead arts integration workshops in the school with arts educators, grade level teachers, and students and teach lessons as an example for the educators or coaches.

In an effort to strengthen the effectiveness of BTSArts site visits and clarify the mentoring process, the WSU BTSArts Program Coordinator asks the arts educators and instructional coaches to establish three goals for the school year and reflect on the achievement of these goals at the end of the school year. Subsequent Program Coordinator visits focus on assisting arts educators and instructional coaches as needed or by request.

Continuing Education Course: Creating Basic Videos in the Arts - Spring 2021

WSU BTSARTS INTERNSHIP

<u>Description:</u> The WSU BTSArts internship offers WSU students the opportunity to learn about arts integration and experience the BTSArts program. This is a paid internship, totaling 20 hours a semester where pre-service teachers engage in online modules, observations, and teaching experiences with BTSArts educators and Artists-in-Residence. The purpose of this internship is to provide a pathway to BTSArts by providing WSU students with the opportunity to form relationships with local districts/schools and gain direct transferable skills to fulfill upcoming new positions with BTSArts. Successful interns will be offered the opportunity to repeat the internship in following semesters to focus on deepening their learning through additional hands-on teaching experiences. This project was generously supported by the Beverley Taylor Sorenson Foundation. The Fall 2020 internship was postponed due to COVID-19. The Spring 2021 internship was delivered virtually due to COVID-19 restrictions.

In Spring 2021, the BTSArts Internship supported four BTSArts interns. Of these four interns, 3 were repeating the internship for a second time. The interns consisted of 2 drama interns and 2 visual art interns. Drama interns worked directly with Penny Caywood virtually at Wasatch Elementary School following two grades each for four weeks. Visual art interns worked virtually with Erinne Roundy following one class for eight weeks. Erinne worked directly with North Davis Preparatory Academy through an artist-in-residence program connected to the BTSArts internship. This artist-in-residence program connects schools with the BTSArts Program and also provides a laboratory for WSU BTSArts interns. This artist-in-residence program supported a ten week visual art and science integrated unit plan with first graders. *Please view Survey Results Link for survey results and Supplemental Materials Link for photos (the links can be found at the end of this report)*.

ARTSBRIDGE

Artsbridge Utah Birds and Ecosystems Hanging Installation: As part of the Fall 2021 HNRS 1530 ArtsBridge Murals course, under the direction of Professors Tamara Goldbogen and Erinne Roundy, WSU students partnered with the Ogden Nature Center, Fourth Graders from Shadow Valley Elementary, and Brent Rhodes, BTSArts Visual Arts educator, on a faux-stained glass project that focused on Utah Birds and Ecosystems. With support from the WSU Arts Learning Collaborative, the WSU students (ArtsBridge: Murals) and elementary students (from Shadow Valley Elementary School) traveled to the Ogden Nature Center, learned about Utah wildlife and habitats, and created a hanging installation designed to mitigate bird collisions that is displayed at the Ogden Nature Center.

BEVERLEY TAYLOR SORENSON ENDOWED CHAIR FOR ARTS LEARNING

Description: The Beverley Taylor Sorenson Endowed Chair for Arts Learning position requires a unique combination of scholarship, teaching, service, and statewide arts education, collaboration, and representation. The Endowed Chair's primary responsibility is the development and stewardship of the endowed arts program created to perpetuate arts-integrated learning at WSU and in Ogden, Weber, Davis, and Morgan service areas. To fulfill this role, the Endowed Chair:

- Provides high-quality professional development to improve the teaching skills of pre- and in- service educators at WSU.
- Researches and develops best practices for arts-integration to support the statewide BTSArts.
- Chairs a WSU Arts Learning Collaborative Advisory Committee composed of faculty and staff from the College of Arts and Humanities and the College of Education.
- Participates in BTSArts University Partner meetings and makes recommendations to the USBE on the BTSArts for continued program development, as needed.
- Collaborates with Endowed Chairs at Universities across the state to provide arts integration professional development for pre- and in-service teachers.
- Attends BTSArts hosted events at partner Universities and statewide arts conferences to represent WSU and create future professional development collaborations.

BTSARTS PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Description: Kelly Bruce Glynn has worked as the Beverley Taylor Sorenson Arts Learning Program Coordinator since July 8, 2018. The two priorities for the position are to 1) support BTSArts educators and instructional coaches in the WSU service area, and 2) provide high-quality professional development to BTSArts educators and instructional coaches in the WSU service area. Throughout the 2020-2021 school year, Kelly made over 40 visits to BTSArts schools and districts for trainings and observations where she provided specific feedback on high-quality arts integrated teaching practices.

Due to COVID-19 many school visits were not able to be conducted for the safety of school students and staff. Throughout this time she contacted administrators, educators, and instructional coaches about events throughout the year and administered the beginning and end of year WSU BTSArts surveys. The surveys were used to help plan professional development, assess needs, and provide valuable support and mentorship for educators, instructional coaches, principals, and administrators.

In an effort to provide high-quality professional development to BTSArts educators, instructional coaches, and district administrators in the WSU service area, Kelly developed, implemented, and programmed the WSU BTSArts Fall and Winter Virtual PLC. In addition to the PLC, Kelly Coordinated the 2020-2021 workshop series, which included developing and teaching the Continuing Education course Creating Basic Videos in the Arts. This Continuing Education course was supported by the Utah State Board of Education and available to art educators statewide. This course focused on the creation of basic art tutorial videos (creation, shooting, editing, and producing) to support virtual learning formats.

Kelly's role also supports finances, marketing, communication, and other operational duties that include: reserving rooms, creating flyers, certificates of completion, surveys, uploading re-licensure points for certified teachers, communicating with presenters and attendees about events, processing invoices and orders for services and goods, processing payments for presenters, managing registration for events, organizing supplies and materials, handling day-of event details, and updating/maintaining the WSU Arts Learning Collaborative social media pages and website (weber.edu/artslearning).

In addition to her work as the BTSArts Coordinator, Kelly co-designed, implemented, and co-secured funding for the WSU BTSArts Internship which aims to give students experiences working in arts integration and insight into BTSArts in the WSU region. She regularly adjuncts within the Department of Performing Arts in the Dance and Theatre area. Kelly currently serves as the Chair Elect for Professional Development on the Utah Dance Education Organization. Kelly has presented at the following workshops:
