Once I am qualified, how do I improve my chances of getting accepted?

- Grades are one of the biggest parts of the selection process; especially support courses (HTHS Integrated Human Anatomy and Physiology Series *OR* Zoology Anatomy and Physiology Series) and MLS 1113 and MLS 1114. Average GPA of accepted students is 3.2, with grades of 'B+' or higher in support. Support Courses completion and grades, MLS 1113 and 1114 lab skills assessment and MLS 1113 and 1114 grades are weighted *heavily*.
- Complete the WSU Math Quantitative Literacy QL (1030, 1035, 1040, or 1050) requirement. 80% of accepted students have completed this requirement.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I need letters of recommendation?

No. The application process consists of a fee and submission of the online application.

What other steps must I complete if I am accepted into the MLS program?

The following must be completed by the end of the fall semester after being accepted into the program:

- Immunization records
- Drug Test (approximately \$40)
- Criminal Background Check (approximately \$35)

All students admitted to the WSU MLS AAS and BS programs must comply with a departmental background check and drug screen test. If the background check reveals a history of convicted felonies or the drug test results are positive for controlled substances, the student will be dismissed from the program and will not be entitled to any refunds of tuition or other fees.

Are there any requirements for non-native English-speaking students?

The ability to communicate verbally and in written form is basic to the provision of health care services in a safe and effective manner. Therefore, students for whom English is not their native language will be asked to demonstrate English proficiency by submitting an English Proficiency Exam Score on their application.
