Policies and Procedures for Advising

- If you are unable to keep your appointment, please call to cancel or reschedule
- Arrive 10 minutes early with your picture ID for your appointment (if late, you will need to reschedule)

Appointment Scheduling

- Have your W# ready and contact your Early College Advisor
- Identify yourself as an Early College student
- Identify your school district or high school
- Book your appointments as far in advance as possible (appointment availability is limited immediately before each semester and during peak registration times)

Advisor Responsibilities

Your Advisor is expected to:

- o Treat you as a responsible student
- Create a positive, safe environment in which you feel comfortable asking questions
- Effectively communicate the General Studies degree requirements
- Help you understand the purposes and goals of General Education requirements
- o Provide information about campus resources
- Keep accurate records of your one-on-one advising appointments
- Maintain confidentiality, based on advising ethics and federal privacy laws

Student Responsibilities

You are expected to:

- Treat your advisor with respect
- Arrive on time for appointments, with your phone off
- Attend New Student Orientation and your required Early College New Student Appointment
- Schedule at least one appointment each semester with your Early College Advisor (know your advisor's name and how to contact him/her)
- o Come prepared with questions/materials for advisement
- o Take notes and ask questions during your appointment
- Follow through on your decisions and accept responsibility for them
- o Contact your advisor when you are facing challenges

In your required Early College New Student Advising Appointment, your Early College Advisor will go over a checklist of information that includes most of this material. It is your responsibility to ask questions about anything you don't understand. We are here to support you and enjoy doing so!

Early College Academic Standards

Early College students are required to maintain a minimum cumulative Weber State University grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 and earn passing grades in all WSU classes. (Note: Passing grades for General Education requirements differ; consult the catalog for specific grade requirements.) Students who earn an E (failing grade) or UW (unofficial withdrawal) or who fail to earn at least a 2.0 GPA are placed on Early College Program Probation and are required to repeat the failed class and/or raise their cumulative GPA to at least 2.0 the following semester. Failure to repeat the class and/or raise the cumulative GPA to at least 2.0 will result in dismissal from the Early College Program.
