QUANTITATIVE LITERACY (QL)

Quantitative Literacy (QL) is satisfied at Weber State University by one of the following routes:

1. Completing Math 1030 or 1040 with a grade of "C" or better.
2. Completing Math 1050 or 1080 with a grade "C" or better.
3. Completing any mathematics course with a "C" or better that has either Math 1050 or 1080 as a prerequisite.
4. An ACCUPLACER score of 70 or higher on the CLM exam.
5. A COMPASS score of 65 or higher on the CA exam.
6. A score of 3 or higher on the AP Calculus.
7. A score of 3 or higher on the AP Statistics exam.

Placement in Courses with Mathematics Prerequisites (Red = paramedic requirements)

Students satisfying Quantitative Literacy through routes 2-6 above have also satisfied the Math 1050 prerequisite for any course. Route 7 satisfies the Math 1010 and/or Math 1040 prerequisite for any course.

Placement in Mathematics Courses

The following chart indicates placement based on ACT, ACCUPLACER, or COMPASS exams

COMPOSITION (EN)

English Composition Requirement - (Red = paramedic requirements)

Students seeking the Associate of Applied Science degree must pass English EN1010 with a “C” grade (2.0) or better in order to satisfy the Composition requirement. Students seeking any other degree must pass both English EN 1010 and EN 2010 with “C” grades. Students placed in developmental English courses ND 0900 and ND 0955 must also pass those courses with “C” grades or higher. Please note that English composition courses, whether developmental or not, are sequential and can not be taken out of numerical order.

English Placement

Students are placed in the English developmental/composition sequence of courses either by ACT scores or by ACCUPLACER scores.

Note: English ND 0960 does not satisfy the Developmental English Requirement for students admitted to Weber State University after Fall Semester 2005. Students admitted after Fall Semester 2005 who take English ND 0960 will still be required to take English ND 0900 and/or English ND 0955, depending on their English placement.
