_____ To be eligible to apply, you must be able to check **two (2)** courses from one of the two Science Options listed below, showing you have completed the course with a grade of '**C**' or **higher**.

All courses within Science Option 1 or 2 must be completed prior to starting the Dental Hygiene program and must not be older than 7 years from the start date of the Dental Hygiene program:

_____ Complete the Online application by **January 15th**. Applications are available during the month of October by visiting <https://www.weber.edu/dentalhygiene/dentalas.html>

Ensure most recent semester grades and degree, if applicable, are posted on your transcript before uploading a copy of your unofficial transcript(s) to the application. This may necessitate the need to complete the application in early-January as opposed to December.

Once I am qualified, how do I improve my chances of getting accepted?

- Students who have all courses complete within one of the Science Options and all of the Support courses complete with a grade of '**C**' or higher -prior to the application deadline - will be given additional consideration.
- **Obtain Dental Experience!** Accepted students have at least 50+ volunteer hours, which is good. Paid experience is even better. Having a Dental Assisting Certificate from an accredited dental assisting program is the best.
 - It is **MANDATORY** to have experience prior to starting the program. Students will not be allowed to begin the program if they have no experience in the field.
- Complete an AS/AA or BS/BA degree from a regionally-accredited institution. AS in HTHS is a little more.
- Although first-time applicants may be accepted into the program, additional consideration will be given to previously qualified applicants who have completed **all** of the Science Option and Support Courses.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do my credits transfer from other institutions?

The best thing to do is to become a Weber State student and submit your transcript(s) for evaluation. Then you'll know exactly what they equal. There is the Weber.edu/transferguide to search for courses from other regionally-accredited colleges/universities to see how those courses *may* transfer to Weber State University.

Is there a time limit to how old my courses can be?

Science Option courses must be completed within seven years from the start date of the program.

I have completed all of my Science Option and Support courses, what should I take while waiting for acceptance into the program?

You may complete requirements for an Associate of Science Degree in Health Sciences or General Studies. Also, you may start working on upper-division courses (3000+ level courses) for the Bachelor's degree in Dental Hygiene (*See the DCHP Admissions Advisement Office for the Dental Hygiene UD Upper Division list*).

How many students apply and are accepted each year?

Traditionally, there have been between 120-140 applicants each year for 32 positions.

Is there a wait-list?

No, there is no wait-list for the Dental Hygiene program; however, the program is competitive-based. Your GPA from all prerequisite/support courses, GPA from the Science Option courses, dental experience, a degree, and how much you have completed are used for determining selection into the program.

Do I need letters of recommendation?

No, the department does not ask for letters of recommendation with the application.

Do I need an ACT score?

No, the ACT score is not used in the selection process. Your completed prerequisite courses and grades will be looked at in the selection process.

Are there night courses available?

The prerequisite courses may be done at night or online; however, the Dental Hygiene program is taught during the day. It is a full-time program; you need to be available from 8:00-5:00 Monday through Friday, once you are accepted for the program. It's a four-semester program (Fall, Spring, Fall, Spring).
