

Annie Dee Taylor School of Nursing - Associate of Science Degree RN (4 semester / 16-month program) - Applicant Checklist for Spring 2026

APPLICATION CYCLES AND POSITIONS AVAILABLE: The application will be available on the WSU Nursing Website at (weber.edu/nursing) at the appropriate time indicated for each application cycle listed below. Students who do not live in Utah must visit [this website](https://continue.weber.edu/wsuoonline/state-authorization/) (<https://continue.weber.edu/wsuoonline/state-authorization/>) before applying to and/or enrolling in any Weber State Nursing program.

The AS (RN) program offers a Hybrid-Online option and plans to do so every semester thereafter. After one secures admission to the nursing program, students will be able to select WSU Ogden, WSU Davis (Layton), or the Hybrid-Online option. It will be on a first-come, first-served basis. Once a student receives their acceptance, they need to respond ASAP. The WSU/Ogden and WSU/Davis locations function the following way: Two days a week (Monday through Friday), students will be committed to a nursing class day (1 day) and a lab, clinical/clinical sim day (1 day) for the first 3 semesters of a 4-semester program. In the final 4th semester, the class day moves to online, and students complete a capstone, rather than a lab, clinical/clinical sim. The WSU/Hybrid-Online functions the following way: One day a week (Monday through Friday), students will be committed to a nursing lab, clinical/clinical sim day for the first 3 semesters of the 4-semester program. The Theory portion of the program is online for all 4 semesters. In the 4th semester, students complete a capstone (135 hours). No lab, clinical, or clinical sim will be held.

- **Spring Semester 2026 Cycle:** applications available mid-June 2025
 - ***96 positions** – once admitted, may choose WSU/Ogden (32 positions), WSU/Davis in Layton (32 positions), or Hybrid-Online (32 positions)
 - **Application deadline:** September 4, 2025 **Start:** January 5, 2026, and attend spring/summer / fall 2026 & spring 2027
 - **Graduation date:** April 30, 2027 **RN to BSN progression start date:** May 10, 2027
 - **Summer Semester 2026 Cycle:** applications available first week of October 2025
 - ***96 positions** – once admitted, may choose WSU/Ogden (32 positions), WSU/Davis in Layton (32 positions), or Hybrid-Online (32 positions)
 - **Application deadline:** January 15, 2026 **Start:** May 4, 2026, and attend summer & fall 2026 and spring & summer 2027
 - **Finish date:** August 18, 2027 [Students will have the option to walk on April 30, 2027, or December 17, 2027. No university grad ceremony in August.]
 - **RN to BSN progression start date:** August 30, 2027
 - **Fall Semester 2026 Cycle:** applications become available mid-February 2026.
 - ***96 positions** – once admitted, may choose WSU/Ogden (32 positions), WSU/Davis in Layton (32 positions), or Hybrid-Online (32 positions)
 - **Application deadline:** May 15, 2026 **Start:** August 24, 2026, and attend fall 26, spring/summer/fall 2027
 - **Graduation date:** December 17, 2027 **RN to BSN progression start date:** January 10, 2028
- * Number of accepted students is subject to change. The School of Nursing will notify applicants in a timely manner regarding any changes.**

I understand that only materials uploaded to the application by the deadline will be considered for review. Items sent to Weber State (transcripts, certificates, degrees) that are not reflected in the application attachments will not be considered. Once the application is submitted, no changes or additions may be made unless permission is granted by WSU Nursing Admissions *more than 72 hours before the deadline* (rholt@weber.edu or healthprofessions@weber.edu).

APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: You must meet the criteria by the application deadline to be eligible to apply.

- ☐ 1) Nine (9) or more credit hours completed from the **PREREQUISITES** and the **ADDITIONAL NURSING SUPPORT COURSES** list (excluding CNA).
Of the (9) credit hours, at least 1 of the 4 science-specific courses listed in the "Science Specific Courses" list must be completed by the application deadline. All prereq.'s and support courses need to be passed with a "C" or better grade. **Applicants MUST BE ENROLLED in any remaining Science Specific prerequisites during the Fall 2025 semester to be considered qualified to apply. If you have not finished or are not enrolled in Fall 2025, then please wait to apply.**
- ☐ 2) Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. WSU School of Nursing uses a CUMULATIVE GPA from all transcripts that are from "Regionally Accredited" colleges or universities that transfer to WSU. All courses must be completed and posted to your college transcripts by the application deadline. **Please note:** Early College and concurrent enrollment courses must be posted to the college transcript by the application deadline. Independent Study courses must be completed and posted to a college transcript by the application deadline in order to be counted. No exceptions!
- ☒ 3) **For International Students Applicants Only:** Must upload an English Proficiency test score by the application deadline to be considered qualified. Applications without a test score or a test score meeting the required level or higher will not be eligible for review.

TOEFL iBT: 83 or higher

IELTS academic: 7 or higher

DUOLINGO English Test: 120 or higher

PREREQUISITES: 5 TOTAL – must be completed prior to the start of the program if admitted. All prerequisite courses must be passed with a "C" or better grade.

- ☐ CNA or EMT: Current Proof of Certification as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) or a current Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certificate is required of all accepted applicants. A copy of the certification or registry expiration date is required and must be provided prior to the start of the program. Contact the Utah CNA Registry (801-547-9947) for questions concerning the CNA. For questions concerning the EMT certificate, contact the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services (801-273-6666). It is highly recommended that this requirement be met by the application deadline, as it will help in the selection process. If admitted, your certification must be current at the start of the program to which you are admitted. Completion of just the course is not acceptable. Military with **medical background** (documentation on a DD-214 and within the last 2 years) also acceptable, please see an advisor.

SCIENCE SPECIFIC COURSES: At least 1 of the 4 science-specific courses must be completed prior to the application deadline noted above (C or better). Applicants **MUST BE ENROLLED** in any remaining Science Specific prerequisites during the Summer 2025 semester to be considered qualified to apply. If you have not finished or enrolled in them all, then please wait until the next application cycle to apply.

☼ Chemistry 1110, 1130, or 1210 are the 3 transferable courses from other institutions to Weber State. Please note that the Chemistry science prerequisite is a course and lab (both required). If an applicant has not taken the lab with their Chemistry course, they will have to do so in order for it to count as the prerequisite and earn points, etc. All applicants must verify that their Chemistry course and lab will count ahead of applying. ▲ **WSU Math Q.L. (Quantitative Literacy Requirement):** Those with a previous degree AS, BS, MS, from a “regionally accredited” college or university already meet the Q.L. requirement. A Cert of Gen Ed. Completion counts as well. Certain MATH AP (3,4, or 5) will work. Any other math course that fulfills the Q.L. requirement will count. See Advisor.

ADDITIONAL NURSING SUPPORT COURSES: Four (4) additional support courses can be completed prior to the start of the nursing program if admitted or during the two (2) year Associate Degree RN Program. All support courses must be passed with a “C” grade or better.

If you have questions, please speak with a pre-nursing advisor. If not admitted to WSU before application submission and have worked through transfer coursework articulation, some courses indeed may not count, and it will be the next application cycle before the application may be considered with such.

Please note: In addition to the prerequisite courses listed on the first page of this document, and the above listed additional nursing support courses, there are additional university-level Core, Breadth, and Degree requirements that must be met in order to graduate with an Associate of Science Degree and be eligible to take the RN-NCLEX exam. If you have questions about these additional requirements, please see an advisor. If you have completed the AP exams or CLEP credit, please see an advisor. SELECTION PROCESS: A competitive point application process takes place when we have more applicants than positions available. Criteria used in the point ranking process include: CUM GPA; science course grades (4 courses); degrees (AS, AA, BS, BA, MS, MA) completed and posted to transcripts (CGEC / Inter Passport LOC); all science and additional support courses completed (all 8 courses); Pathophysiology (HTHS 2230), Introductory Microbiology (MICR 1113), Medical Terminology (HTHS 1101) and Nutrition (NUTR 1020) courses done by deadline; CNA/EMT certification (current); veteran status; alternate; and re-applicant status.

If a student is admitted, it is important to respond quickly to the acceptance information that is sent via email. Acceptance letters (or not) will be emailed within 5 to 6 weeks after the final deadline for each application cycle. It is required after gaining admission to the Nursing Program to have your W# and Weber email to request a particular placement, schedules, etc. If you have not applied to Weber State University, please do so now: WSU Admissions (weber.edu/admissions)

Program Costs: Tuition & Student Fee: 4 semesters x \$2,948 per semester, approximately = \$12,500 (in May 2025 tuition dollars). Tuition is released each April for the following academic year. +**Course Fees:** some courses during the 4 semesters of the program have additional fees = \$950 (approximately)

+**Additional Estimated program costs (such things as books, uniforms, etc.):** \$1,500 approximately

Estimated Total Cost for the 4-semester AS (RN) program (does not include any other coursework beyond nursing or travel costs to clinicals (s)): **\$14,950**

All admitted applicants will be required to complete a background check, drug screen, and physical exam, and have personal health insurance. Admission to the program is contingent upon submission of a satisfactory background check and a negative drug screen. If a background check reveals a history of criminal actions, such as a Class C misdemeanor, Class B misdemeanor, Class A misdemeanor, or felony, regardless of an active Plea of Abeyance, the admissions committee will review the criminal action and admissions to the program may be denied. To comply with the requirements of our clinical partners, each applicant must pass a 12-panel drug test for entrance into the nursing program. A positive drug screen for legally prescribed medications will require the applicant to submit a prescription to the Medical Review Officer (MRO) associated with the Document Management System (Verified Credentials). Currently, Medical Marijuana Cards are not accepted by all of our clinical partners and, therefore, will not be accepted by The School of Nursing. Any applicant testing positive for Marijuana, even with a Medical Marijuana card, will not be cleared to start the program. **In the event the applicant does not meet the admission requirements, they will not be entitled to any refund of tuition dollars or other fees.**

Physically challenged and learning-disabled students must register with the disability office prior to starting the nursing program if special assistance is required. Please call 801-626-6413.
