

The Weber State University Interior Design Program is happy to entertain off-campus interior design projects for various community organizations and individuals. Although the scope of each project is unique, the interior design faculty have established project criteria that meets curriculum standards.

Each project will be reviewed and assessed by faculty to determine appropriateness as well as availability of students in relation to the timeline for the project.

Students may work in teams or individually, based on project requirements.

If accepted, interior design students will complete projects that include the following design stages:

Programming and preliminary needs assessment
Site inspection
Review of construction documents, scope of project
Schedules
Color selection
Furnishings specification
Formal presentation of project

NOTE: Space Planning and/or construction documents are not included.

Any services beyond the scope indicated above may be considered on a case by case basis.

The interior design program reserves the right to refuse any and all projects.

The interior design program reserves the right to retain all presentations and construction documents for accreditation purposes at the conclusion of the project.

Because of the technical nature of design services, the interior design program will require a design fee for each project. Design fees will provide scholarship funding for students obtaining a 4-year Interior Design degree.

## Design costs are as follows:

**RESIDENTIAL DESIGN:** 

excluding kitchen and bath: \$175 per room

NKBA standard kitchen and/or bath design: \$275 per room

**COMMERCIAL DESIGN:** 

0-500 sq. feet: \$275

500-1000 sq. feet: \$375

1000-2000 sq. feet: \$525

+2000 sq. ft. assessed on a case by case basis

If it is deemed that the project does not meet curriculum standards, the project can be given to a student design team to complete if the individual wishes.

In either case, students will be mentored by a faculty member.

Design fees for student teams remain the same as those accepted for inclusion within an interior design course.

Design fees will be paid to the interior design scholarship fund:

½ at inception of project

½ at formal presentation of project
