2024 SEMINAR VENUE

Weber State University is honored to welcome ISfTE to its beautiful campus nestled next to the Rocky Mountains near the shores of the Great Salt Lake. WSU was established in 1889 and is nationally ranked.



Approximately 30,000 students attend WSU in one of 255 undergraduate or graduate degree programs. Teacher Education is one of top 10 degree programs at WSU. The university campus' elevation is at 1437 meters or 4715 feet. Temperatures during the Seminar will be cool to comfortable ranging between highs of 65° - 75° F (18 – 24°C) with lows around 45°F (7°C). However, it is not unusual to have snow during the early spring. Expect to experience a variety of temperatures so bring layers of clothing to be comfortable. Recognizing the natural beauty surrounding the area and the emphasis Weber State University places on sustainability, meetings will be held in sustainable carbon neutral capable spaces, attendees will travel via public transportation during seminar events, and technology will be used as much as possible to reduce paper waste.

Traveling to the Seminar

Salt Lake City International Airport (website) is the nearest and largest airport to Weber State. Airlines and their partners include Aeromexico, Air Canada, Alaska, American, Delta, Frontier, Hawaiian, JetBlue, KLM Royal Dutch, Spirit, Southwest, Sun Country, and United. Most likely you will be arriving in terminal A or B if coming from a connection in the USA. Make your way to baggage claim on Level 2. If you arrive at Terminal B you will have a long walk but there is interesting wall art along the way. Once you have collected your baggage follow the signs to public transportation, TRAX, on Level 1. If you are arriving on Monday, April 29th between 6 am and 8 pm





there will be someone by the ISfTE sign to welcome you and present your transportation card to Ogden. The card will be used for all transportation during the seminar. Exit the airport on Level 1 and walk to the TRAX station. Board the green line TRAX train to Salt Lake City. Exit the TRAX train at the North Temple Bridge/Guadalupe Station. When you get off TRAX at the top of the bridge you will have a nice view of Salt Lake City and the mountains. Go down the stairs

or take the elevator to the FrontRunner Train. Board the FrontRunner Train going north to Ogden. Ride the train to the end of the line, Ogden Station. From the Ogden Station, it is an easy 10 minute walk on level sidewalks to the hotel. Depending on the time you arrive it will take about 2 hours from when you get your luggage until you arrive at the hotel. Be sure to drink plenty of water in the high desert air to avoid headaches and altitude sickness.

Accommodations

Delegates are responsible for making their own hotel reservations. The seminar hotel is the Hilton Garden Inn

at 2271 Washington Blvd in Ogden, Utah. Breakfast is included in the room rate. Breakfast is not provided if not staying at the hotel. The hotel is located within walking distance of transportation. Rooms can accommodate 1 to 4 people. The hotel offers free wi-fi, an indoor pool, fitness center, and free parking. How the Seminar Works

You will be assigned to a reading group. You will upload your non-published paper to your assigned reading group in the seminar Google Drive. You will be able to read before the seminar and during the seminar to



thoughtfully read each paper in your group. You can bring paper copies but not required. Reading groups meet together to offer constructive feedback to improve the paper for publications with an international view. After the seminar, all participants will have the opportunity to publish their papers in ISfTE's peer reviewed journal, the Journal of the International Society for Teacher Education (JISTE). JISTE publishes two issues a year, of which one issue is dedicated to the current ISfTE Seminar.

Accompanying Persons

Attendees are welcome to bring an accompanying person. The convening country provides a special program of tours and food for accompanying persons while the seminar participants are meeting. Planned excursions for accompanying persons include visiting the Great Salt Lake, Olympic Sports Venues, and Golden Spike Historical Site.



Privacy

organization, and may be available to parties directly related to the seminar (venue, meals, accommodations).



Cancellation Policy

All cancellations must be made in writing to the 2024 Organizing Committee. Registration cancellations before 1 March 2024 will forfeit \$150 USD to cover administration costs. No refunds will be made after 1 March 2024, but substitute delegates are permitted with proper VISA or passport documentation.

Currency

The national currency is the US Dollar and other currencies are not accepted. Many places accept only credit or money cards. You can convert foreign currency at authorized banks and exchanges centers. ATMS are abundantly available to use your credit card to withdraw USD cash.
