MICHAEL ONDAATJE

Philip Michael Ondaatje, <u>CC FRSL (/on'da:tfi:/;</u> born 12 September 1943), is a <u>Sri</u> <u>Lankan-born Canadian</u> poet, novelist, editor and filmmaker. He is the recipient of multiple literary awards such as the <u>Governor General's Award</u>, the <u>Giller Prize</u>, the <u>Booker Prize</u>, and the <u>Prix Médicis étranger</u>. Ondaatje is also an Officer of the <u>Order of</u> <u>Canada</u>, recognizing him as one of Canada's most renowned living authors, along with others like <u>Margaret Atwood</u>.

In addition to his literary writing, Ondaatje has been an important force in "fostering new Canadian writing" with two decades commitment to <u>Coach House Press</u> (around 1970-90), and his editorial credits on Canadian literary projects like the journal <u>Brick</u>, and the *Long Poem Anthology* (1979), among others.
