## Psychology 3460

Welcome to Social Psychology. Psychology deals with human behavior, and Social Psychology deals with the influence of others on individual behavior.

<u>Text</u>, etc. The name of the text and the dates of the reading assignments are given on the accompanying schedule sheet. Do read the text. Study it carefully and completely.

<u>Tests and Quizzes</u>. Each of the three major tests will consist of 50 multiple choice questions on the block of material. To prepare for the tests, study the book and go over your class notes. Bring a No. 2 pencil for the tests.

The short quizzes will generally be ten true/false questions, taken from in-class lecture, discussion, and activities.

If for some reason you will miss a test or a quiz, please talk to me in advance, if possible, to arrange for a makeup.

<u>Written assignments.</u> A one-page journal article summary is due as indicated on the schedule sheet. This is to be an article pertaining to Social Psychology from a professional source. Be sure to give the reference.

<u>Verbal Assignments</u>. Verbal presentations are to be given, as discussed.

<u>Grades.</u> Your grade is based on the total number of points from tests, quizzes, written assignments and verbal assignments.

<u>Goal.</u> The primary goal of the course is to learn about the basic topics within the field of Social Psychology. We will discuss several different topics, and we will do several in-class exercises that pertain to Social Psychology.
