II. Course Grade

A. Examinations

- Four preliminary examinations will be given during the semester (each will make up 20% of your grade). You will have 3 days to take each exam. Please refer to the EXAMINATIONS link on the course website for more information on taking exams.
- 2. A comprehensive final examination (20% of grade) will be given Dec. 2^{nd} 6^{th} . The final exam will be taken in the same format and procedure as the other exams.
- 3. You may NOT make-up any exam that is missed. You have 3 days to take each exam, so please schedule your time wisely. If you have a scheduling conflict, you may schedule to take an exam a day or two early at no penalty (you must notify me in writing a minimum of one week earlier to do this). NO EXAMINATIONS WILL BE GIVEN AFTER THE EXAMINATION PERIOD IS OVER. Your lowest exam grade will be dropped.

- 4. Your lowest exam grade will be dropped at the end of the semester. If you have an A after the 4th exam, you do not need to complete the comprehensive final, unless you would like to!
- 5. All exams will be taken using chi tester, which is a computerized testing program. You should plan to take the exams at a WSU testing center. You may also set up a proctor to take the exams, if you are not able to make it to a WSU testing center.
