## Psychology 1010

Welcome to Introductory Psychology. Psychology is a very interesting field of study that deals with human behavior- your behavior and my behavior.

Text, etc. The name of the text and the dates of the reading assignments are given on the accompanying schedule sheet. Do read the text. Study it carefully and completely

Test and Quizzes. Each of the four major tests will consist of 50 multiple choice questions on the block of the material. To prepare for the tests, study the book and go over your class notes. Bring a No. 2 pencil for the test.

The short quizzes will generally be ten true/false questions, taken from in-class lecture, discussion and activities.

If for some reason you will miss a test or quiz, please talk to me in advance, if possible, to arrange for a makeup.

Written and Verbal assignments. A one-page summary of a magazine article about psychology is due as indicated on the schedule sheet. Be sure to give the reference. Verbal assignments as discussed.

Grades. Your grade is based on the total number of points from tests, quizzes and written assignments.

Goal. The primary goal of the course is to learn about the basic elements of human behavior. We will discuss several different topics, as you can see from our schedule. The course serves as a foundation for other psychology classes, as well as a “one-shot” exposure to some aspects of the field of psychology.
