RECYCLING CONTAMINATION MATTERS



Here at WSU most of us recycle the right way. However, it only takes one person recycling incorrectly to contaminate a whole bin of recycling.

MAIN CONTAMINATORS?



PLASTIC BAGS

Plastic bags & other plastic material like shrink wrap & bubble wrap are the worst contaminators. They blow away in the wind, polluting our streets & waterways. They also clog machines at sorting facilities which costs extra time & money. Never bag recycling. Quality recycling does not need a bin liner.

FOOD WASTE

Rinse & remove any food waste before putting items in the recycle bin. Leftover liquids, oils, & foods are not recyclable and that food waste soils all of the other good recycling items in the recycle bin too.



WRONG PLASTICS

At WSU, **only plastics 1 & 2 can be recycled.** Check for the recycling symbols at the bottom of plastic products. **No symbol = don't recycle it.**

HAZARDOUS WASTE

This includes **Physical, Biological, & Chemical waste** like glass, used tissues, needles, batteries, & electronics. Do not put these items in the recycle bin. Contact: x6421 to recycle batteries & glass.
